This enables class teachers to identify topics/areas of strength and areas which still need some additional revision or further support. All Year 11 students should know how to use these resources and analysis the exam resources following these trial exams.

	2. Mathswatch - these online exam papers mark themselves and give you a grade as you				
	work through them. Go to the Mathswatch website, log in using your name e.g. for

	3. Your "Practice Papers Plus" book - 6 exam papers with hints, tips, video solutions and				
	full answers in the back of the book so you can check it and mark it.

	your weaker areas from each of the six papers. Put the Sparx Code into the Independent				
	Learning box in Science Sparx to build your own revision programme. Use your revision guides				
	and Bitesize along with revision cards to help plug those gaps				
French	1. The speaking exams run from 28 April to 2 May. Your child should be revising their answers to the questions in all 3 Themes (29 answers in total). It would help if parents could listen to their child's answers.				
	2. Vocabulary revision from the yellow vocabulary booklet. Your child only needs to				
	know the English translation of the word, not the spelling of the word in French.				
	3. Role-play and photo card revision from the A5 blue or green booklet provided by the department.				
	4. Your child has a Collins French revision guide provided for them by school, which contains speaking, listening, reading and writing practice in it.				
	5. Don't forget the French revision classes on 15 April (10.00-12.00 for the A half) and 12.30-14.30 for the B half.)
